A database comprised of thousands of full-text articles from more than 150 journals in the areas of design, architecture and the humanities. However, Jstor only has past issues; there are no current articles in Jstor.

- You need full-text articles from home
- You need to research Liberal Arts or Social Sciences topics
- You need to research design history

- Search for, download and print full articles
- save, export or email citations
- Quickly browse articles in older issues of magazines.

Search

Use **advanced search** to narrow and focus your search

Browse

Click on browse to search for journals by title, discipline or publisher. Choosing a title will take you to the range of volumes available & then select the volume, issues and finally article you wish to read.



tips

- Searching- use the drop-down menu next to the search box to select 'Abstract' & then enter a subject into the search box. This is assuming that the author mentioned the 'subject' of article in his Abstract.
- Use quotation marks around phrases
- Limit searches by Type (Article, for ex.)
- Choose a date range, if needed
